Subject: Comment on the Ryedale plan local sites document; site consultation

As a resident of Malton, I would like to comment on the site options proposed for Malton & Norton

The questions posed are

What are your views on the Council's preferred sites?

I think that the preferred sites should first and foremost protect the natural beauty of the area. Any selection should take into account any impact on the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (ANOB), and any impact on the ANOB should be a reason not to select the site. Further, any site selection should not add to the already alarming traffic, congestion and pollution problems in Malton town centre. This means that any new developments should have easy and readily available access to the A64 without putting further traffic pressure on the town.

Given this, I would object to plans to develop sites 218 and 249 (both on Castle Howard Road).
