Dear Sir/Madam

Nawton parish Council would like you to consider their comments to the sites put forward in Nawton. Site 522 has been sold and site 55 has already been developed.

Nawton has more than doubled in size in the last 20 years and recently has had 36 new houses built in the last 2 years. We also have an allocated exemption site for another 20 houses which Yorkshire Housing own.

The other sites are not suitable 105 being too big and would ruin the rural aspect of the village, the other sites would bring chaos, congestion and safety issues on the very small access onto Station Road, there is also the problem of a ransom strip. Considering the increase in traffic from the exemption site in the future, and each new house having at least 2 cars because there is no adequate bus service to get people to work no new development should be considered.

Beadlam, our neighbouring village has had no development and if any development were to take place it should be there. The most important reason being there is a site on the South side of the village which could possibly lead to a road being built to the school. The current access is too small and causes concern for safety.

It is for these reasons that we would like all sites in Nawton to be discounted permanently.
